**How will I get information about H1N1 and

- **Course-specific announcements:** Check the announcement pages of your **Angel course sites** on a regular basis. Faculty will post any announcements about particular courses to their individual course Angel sites.
- **Broadcast-emails** pertaining to H1N1 issues for graduate students in the School of Medicine will be sent as needed from Dr. Allen Rawitch. *Please check your kumc.edu email at least once a day!*
- **Text Messages:** KUMC has the capability to broadcast texts to the entire campus of users who have opted in to receive these emergency messages, not to individual schools, groups or classes. At this time we do *not* anticipate using texting for school- or class-specific announcements due to the system limitations. Should a flu-related emergency affect everyone at KUMC, then you would receive a text if you signed up to receive emergency texts Go to mykumc.edu to verify whether you have opted in for this service. *Remember, check your email daily.*

**Vaccination information for H1N1 and the seasonal flu:** We anticipate that flu shots and H1N1 shots will be available later this fall. *Watch your email for details.*

**If you get sick:**

1. Stay home if you experiences symptoms as described on the Student Health website.
2. If you are **not** involved in patient care activities, stay away from school until at least 24 hours after the fever is gone (without using fever-reducing medications).
3. If you are involved in patient care activities, you must not participate in clinical work for at least seven days from the onset of symptoms or until fever free for 24 hours, whichever is longer.
4. Notify the faculty members for every class in which you are enrolled by either calling or emailing them, both when you get sick and after you are better. Absentee notes from Student Health will not be given during this flu period.
