New **KU** chancellor marks historic selection

The Kansas Board of Regents announced May 29 that Bernadette Gray-Little, PhD, will be the 17th chancellor at The University of Kansas.

Gray-Little, who will be the first woman and first African American to lead KU, will begin her chancellorship Aug. 15.

"She rose to the top of an exceptionally talented and competitive pool of applicants," said **Donna Shank**, chair of the Board of Regents. "Dr. Gray-Little's outstanding record of academic excellence and impressive administrative leadership throughout her notable career, along with

her inspiring enthusiasm and character, make it clear that she is ideally suited to propel KU to even loftier heights."

Gray-Little is the executive vice chancellor and provost at the University of

North Carolina at Chapel Hill, a position she has held since 2006. She is a former dean of UNC's College of Arts and Sciences and a former executive associate provost at UNC. Gray-Little earned a PhD and a MS from St. Louis University and an AB from Marywood College in Pennsylvania.

"I look forward to working with Dr. Bernadette Gray-Little to continue the medical center's excellent track record of educating the next generation of health care workers, conducting lifesaving research and continuing to provide world-class patient care," said **Barbara Atkinson, MD**, executive vice chancellor

of University of Kansas Medical Center.

"Having been part of the leadership at a university that already has a National Cancer Institute-designated Cancer Center, Dr. Gray-Little will be a tremendous asset as we continue our quest for NCI designation here in the Heartland."

Added Chancellor **Robert Hemenway, PhD**: "I congratulate Dr. Gray-Little on being selected for the best job in the world. Good universities always make good hires and this is an excellent hire. I offer any assistance I can give in ensuring her transition is smooth. KU will be in good hands."

Endoscopy recognized for quality, safety

The American Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy has honored The University of Kansas Hospital's Endoscopy Center for promoting high standards for safety and quality.

The center is among 124 endoscopy units in the U.S. to be named to the ASGE's

Endoscopy Unit Recognition Program. Only one other center in the Kansas City area has received this recognition.

This new ASGE program recognizes endoscopy units that follow the organization's guidelines on privileging, quality assurance, endoscopy reprocessing and CDC infection control. Honorees also complete specialized training on principles in quality and

"This validates our efforts to create and maintain a safe environment for our patients in the Endoscopy Center," said **Greg Crawford, RN**, nurse manager.

Located off the main lobby on the hospital's ground floor, the Endoscopy Center allows patients to receive endoscopy procedures from expert staff in one convenient location. The center, which moved to a newly renovated 10,000-square-foot space in August 2008, offers 18 admission and recovery beds and five procedure rooms.

The ASGE recognition program is granted for a three-year renewable period.

The system will automatically archive email and calendared appointments at one year, including those in folders. Emails more than one year but less than three years can be retrieved from the archive.

No changes in email management practices are currently planned for University of Kansas employees.

Approximately 30 percent of emails on the hospital's server are older than three

years. Deleting them will help speed the application and cut hospital costs, said **Mike Nix**, ITS.
