<p><b><u>BRIDGING</u></b></p> <p>Offered three (3) times per year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Fall</li> <li>➤ Winter</li> <li>➤ Spring</li> </ul> <p>Decisions on funding are expected within 6 weeks of submission of the materials indicated below.</p>	<p>The objective of the Bridging Grant program is to provide interim support during a funding hiatus that will be used to improve previously submitted proposals. These competitive awards provide interim support to those who have submitted grants to national organizations that were approved on the basis of scientific merit, but did not receive priority scores within the funding range. This interim funding is intended to assist investigators in obtaining data needed to enhance the success of a revised application.</p>	<p>Up to \$35,000 for one (1) year</p>	<p><b>Fall Bridging:</b> November 17, 2011</p> <p><b>Winter Bridging:</b> February 8, 2012</p> <p><b>Spring Bridging:</b> March 12, 2012</p>	<p>All faculty at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and Wichita are eligible to apply, if their applications meet the following criteria:</p> <p>* Applications for bridging support will only be accepted for grant applications with annual direct costs exceeding \$100,000 and with durations of 2 years or greater. The investigator applying for this bridging award must be the Principal Investigator on that application submitted to the external agency</p> <p>* The application must be eligible for resubmission. Applications that have expended all allotted resubmissions or are in response to a one-time Request for Applications are ineligible for bridging funds. An extensive revision that is to be submitted as a new application may be considered for bridging funding, but is likely to receive a lower ranking.</p> <p>* A commitment to submit a revised application to the same and/or other funding agencies within 18 months of the onset of this award.</p> <p>* Only one bridging award per grant submission is eligible. An investigator who has received prior Research Institute funding is allowed to apply for bridging funds, but only for a different research project.</p> <p>* A commitment to return all remaining funds to the Research Institute in the event that the revised application is funded, or immediately upon accepting a position at another university during the tenure of this award.</p>

<a href="#"><u>LIED ENDOWED BASIC SCIENCE PILOT RESEARCH</u></a>	<p>The Lied Endowed Basic Science Research program is designed to foster the development of research activity in three (3) specific areas in which there is a critical need at KU Medical Center. These areas include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The development of research among clinical investigators, particularly partnerships with established basic researchers.</li> <li>• The development of interactive faculty research programs among two or more established investigators.</li> <li>• The expansion of research ideas by individual faculty to new, currently unfunded activities.</li> </ul>	<p>Up to \$35,000 for one (1) year</p> <p>A competitive renewal process is required for a possible second year of funding.</p>	<p>November 17, 2011</p>	<p>All faculty at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and Wichita are eligible to apply.</p>
<a href="#"><u>CLINICAL PILOT RESEARCH</u></a>	<p>The Clinical Pilot Research program is a broad-base initiative to support faculty in nursing, allied health and medicine. The type of research may include, but is not limited to, outcomes, applied, translational, human populations, human specimens, and/or human subjects. Therefore, outside the area of clinical research, the particular scope will be defined by the faculty member.</p>	<p>Up to \$35,000 for one (1) year</p>	<p>November 17, 2011</p>	<p>All faculty at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and Wichita are eligible to apply.</p> <p>Adjunct faculty with primary appointments at another university may be co-investigators, but may not submit a proposal as Principal Investigator.</p>
<a href="#"><u>START PO1 or RESEARCH CENTER</u></a>	<p>This program is a broad-base initiative to support faculty in nursing, allied health and medicine in terms of helping to develop a grant proposal to a major federal source to establish a PO1 or Research Center. The type of research may include, but is not limited to, outcomes, applied, translational, human populations, human specimens, and/or human subjects. Therefore, outside the area of clinical research, the particular scope will be defined by the faculty member.</p>	<p>Up to \$25,000 for one (1) year</p>	<p>Requests can be made at anytime during the year.</p>	<p>Collaborating faculty groups at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and Wichita are eligible to apply.</p>
