What if I have an eeds card, but I forget to bring it to the session?

- You may still receive credit by signing the “Forgot Your eeds™ Card?” registration form. *Please write legibly.* Your attendance will be manually entered into the eeds system at a later date. *Credit for non-swiping participants will not be available immediately following the session.*
