Registration


There is no fee to attend. Registration will be on site the day of each session.

Your Continuing Education Certificates and Transcripts

KUMC Continuing Education (KUMC CE) utilizes an electronic continuing education documentation system (eeds™). Participants receiving continuing education credit will generate their own certificates and transcripts from their personal eeds account. (Exception: Broadcast sites will receive their certificates/transcripts by mail.)

We recommend that you generate a Multiple-Activity Certificate and an Attendance Transcript annually.

Participants earning continuing education credit receive a one month complimentary access to their transcripts each academic year. Your complimentary access month will be available on June 1 (by default). You can change your complimentary access month from June to the month of your choice. - Your eeds card and eeds account do not expire.
- eeds cards may be used at any activity where an eeds terminal is available.
